- Conversation talking about plans, hobbies, books, daily events. Exploring and using the word of the week together.
- Practise Maths counting accurately, counting to and beyond 10, simple adding and subtraction, baking, shopping, etc.

Homework expectations:

- ► Following the Read, Write, Inc. scheme, reading books will not be sent home until after week 4. Reading for pleasure books will be sent home in week 2.
- Your child will be sent home with three books:
- Reading for pleasure book (This is a book you will read with/to your child)
- ▶ Book from class (This is a book your child will have read in class already. They will read this to you.)
- ▶ Book Bag Book (This is a new book your child will read to you).
