

## **Risk Assessment to Minimise CV19 Risks**

The following document explains Rush Common School's approach for September 2021, in line with the DFE guidance dated 27/8/2021.

System of controls - This is the set of actions schools must take as outlined in DFE guidance

Prevention:	Measures in place to reduce risk
Ensure good hygiene for everyone	<ul> <li>Pupils will wash hands for 20 seconds with warm water and soap on arrival to school, before eating and at the end of the day.</li> <li>Pupils are taught and regularly reminded of how to wash hands thoroughly.</li> <li>There are separate allocated handwashing facilities for each year group to use.</li> <li>Pupil facilities are checked twice throughout the day to ensure there is adequate soap and paper towels.</li> <li>All staff must wash hands or use hand sanitiser on arrival at school, at break time, before and after eating and at the end of the school day.</li> <li>A hand sanitiser machine is located at the front entrance, which visitors must use before entering school.</li> <li>Pupils are taught and reminded of the 'Catch it, bin it kill it' approach. Individual pupils will be reminded of good respiratory hygiene as required.</li> <li>Staff to ensure they use exemplary respiratory hygiene practices when coughing or sneezing.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Tissues to be widely available to enable good respiratory hygiene</li> <li>Bins are changed regularly by site manager</li> <li>Posters are displayed to remind everyone of good respiratory hygiene</li> </ul>
Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes	<ul> <li>The school is being comprehensively cleaned every day from 3-6 with the addition of a cleaning supervisor who inspects cleaning standards every day.</li> <li>The site manager systematically cleans touch points including door handles, light switches, tables/desks, telephones, throughout the school day.</li> <li>Tables that pupils eat on will be thoroughly cleaned</li> <li>Detergents and cloths are provided for each classroom, so staff can quickly clean anything as required.</li> <li>There are widely available wipes in all areas of the school.</li> </ul>
3) Keep occupied spaces well ventilated	<ul> <li>Classrooms, and other spaces are ventilated as much as possible, including opening windows and external doors.</li> <li>In colder weather, windows are opened to allow constant background ventilation.</li> <li>During all breaks, windows and doors are fully opened to purge the air in the space.</li> </ul>
4) Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of Covid-19.	<ul> <li>Parents are asked for their children not to attend school if they have any of the officially recognised symptoms of Covid-19.</li> <li>If a pupil develops symptoms in school, parents will be asked to collect the pupil and follow Government guidance         https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance         Parents will be asked to arrange a test for their child         https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-getting-tested     </li> <li>Staff are asked not to attend school if they have any of the officially recognised symptoms of Covid-19. They will organise a test and follow Government guidance.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Any pupil or staff member who tests positive for Covid-19 must not come into school and should follow government guidance, self-isolating</li> </ul>
for 10 days.
